RED DRESS DAY is Sunday May 5th; a day to remember and honour the thousands of Missing & Murdered Indigenous Women & Girls. The symbolism of the dress began in 2010 when Jaime Black, a Metis artist, created a REDress art installation project. It consisted of <u>empty</u> dresses hanging outside with the colour red representing both vitality and violence. The artist hoped her project would give these women a much needed voice while educating others of their fate. Her installation is now a permanent exhibit at the Canadian Museum of Human Rights in Winnipeg.

The Truth and Reconciliation Commission included this disproportionate violence towards Indigenous women in its Call to Action #41. Our parish is committed to these Calls to Action and hence we honour these missing women
