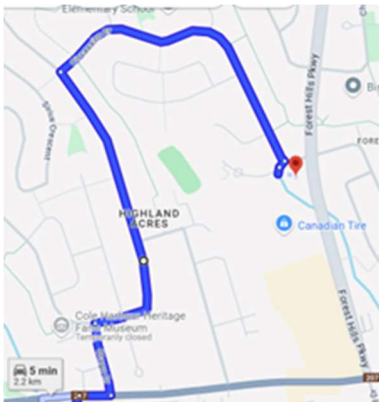

ROAD CLOSURE:

We have been advised that the Forest Hills Parkway end of Circassion Drive will be closed to traffic due to construction on Sunday, **December 1st**. Our **driveway will be accessible**, but we will need to approach from the other end of Circassion Drive, off of Poplar Drive.

Christmas Outreach: This year our parish is looking forward to sponsoring 15 families with Christmas support. Medical Assistance in Dying (MAiD) is a legally available, end of life option for Canadians who are fully assessed, and found to meet strict eligibility criteria. Making the choice to seek MAiD is a deeply personal decision, and such a decision requires accurate, and timely information.

In Nova Scotia, the MAiD program is managed by NS Health. Staff from the MAiD program will deliver a presentation on the criteria, process, and the things people should consider, on Thursday, November 28th, 7 pm, St. Timothy's Hall. Participants will have an opportunity to ask questions from the staff who manage and administer the program. The evening includes a baked potato with all the toppings and a beverage
